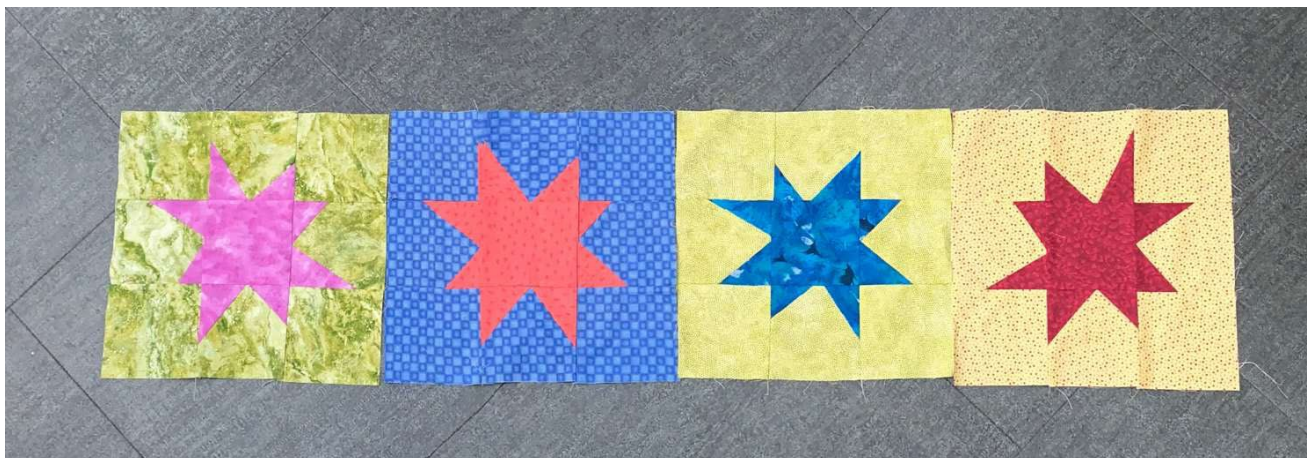


## Wonky Stars



This month we are all going wonky! Yes, you have permission to have uneven points.

Please use an accurate ¼" seam, pressing as you go along. This is a relatively easy block once you get to grips that your "star points" are supposed to be different lengths & you choose their length.

### Fabric type

Please do not use anything other than quilting weight cotton fabric i.e. no curtaining, stretch, suiting or upholstery fabrics. We are also unable to use blocks that include licensed fabrics.

### Colour selection

Select 2 High Contract fabrics 1 for the star & 1 for background.

PLEASE DO NOT USE: Black, White, Brown, Cream, Grey Pink or Flowery Fabric.

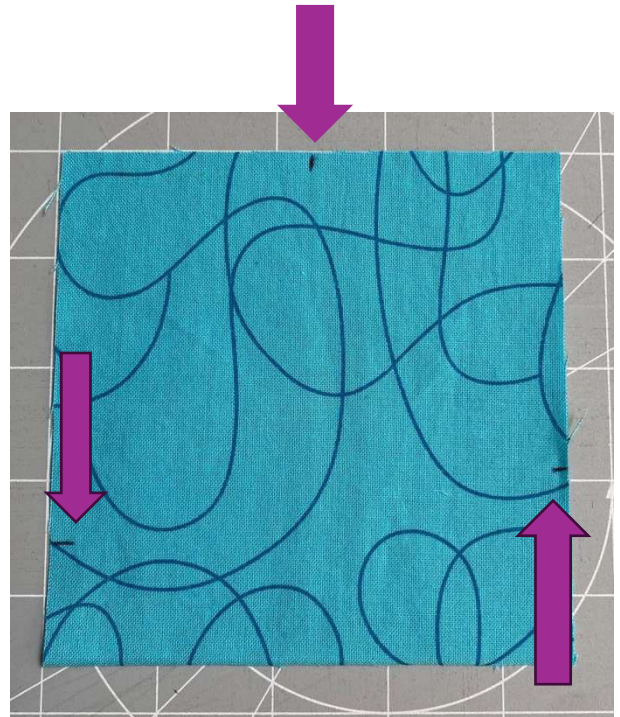
### Fabric requirements

Background fabric....8 x 4½" squares

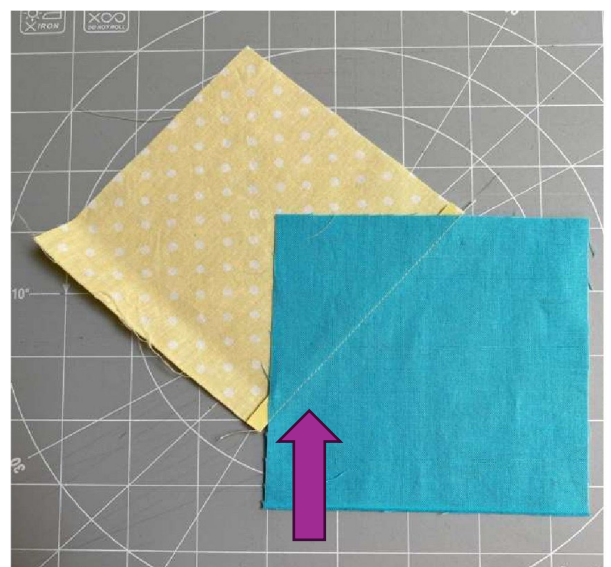
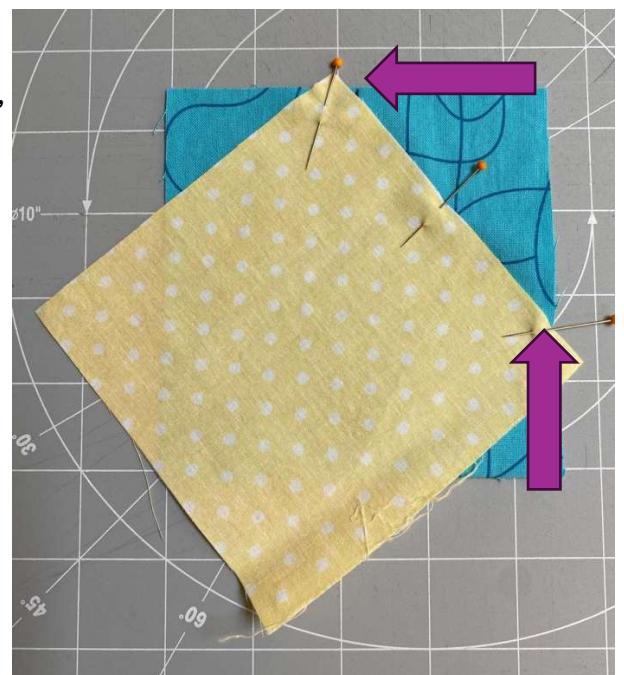
Star fabric.....5 x 4½" squares

## Assembly

1. Take 4 background fabric units.  
On the RS (right side) Find the centre on 1 edge & mark with a pencil point within the seam allowance.  
Measure 3½" down 1 side from top edge & mark with a pencil point within the seam allowance. Measure 3" on opposite side & again, mark with a pencil point within the seam allowance. Do this to all 4 units.  
You will be using these marks as reference points to judge the length of your start legs.



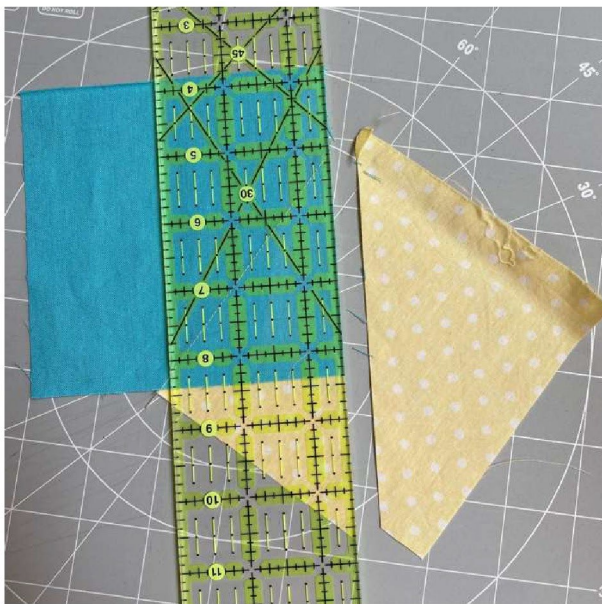
2. Lay star fabric onto background RS together, overlapping the centre mark and position it. ANYWHERE ABOVE THE PENCIL MARK IN THE SEAM ALLOWANCE. THERE IS NO WRONG POSITION. Stitch a 1/4" seam.



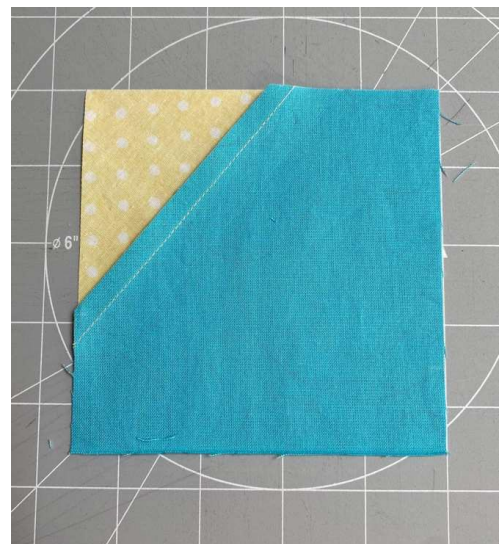
3. Flip star fabric over & press flat on RS.



4. Cut odd excess star point fabric level with edge of background unit.



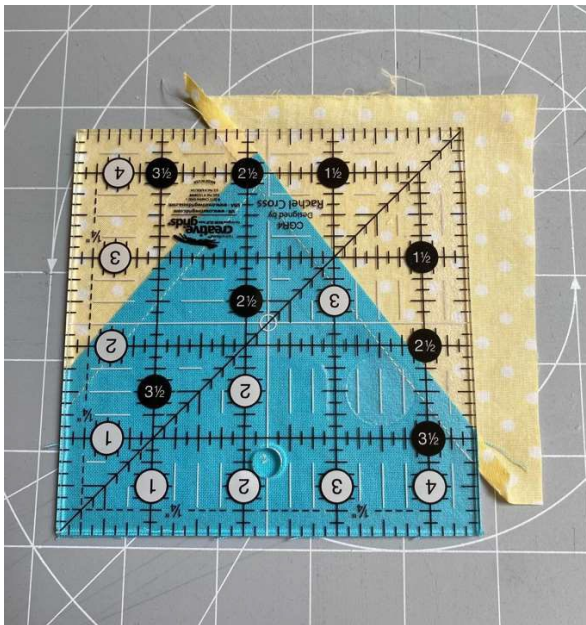
5. Trim seam on background fabric behind star point 1/4" seam allowance. Press flat.



6. Position remaining star fabric on opposite corner anywhere above the pencil mark in the seam allowance, again overlap the mid-point. There is no wrong position.



7. Sew in place as before, press and trim away excess background fabric. Press flat. Trim to 4 1/2" square.





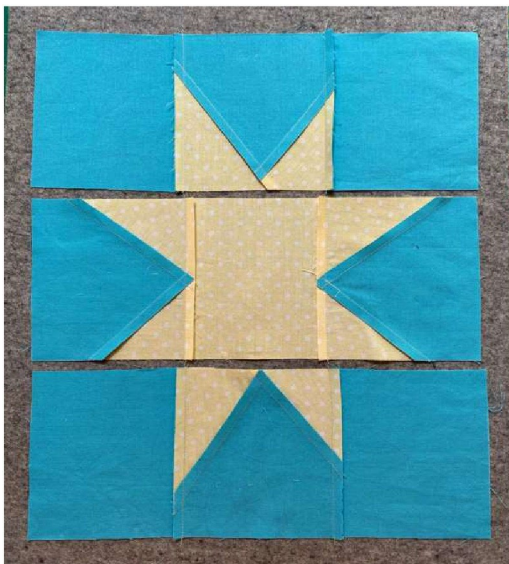
8. Repeat for the other 3 star point units. You now have 4 wonky star points.



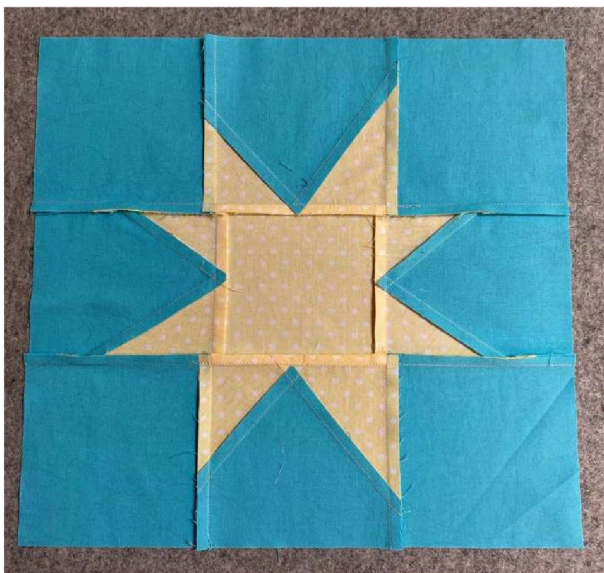
9. Arrange your units to form a 9 patch.



10. Sew in rows of 3 using  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press top & bottom rows away from centre, middle row towards centre.



11. Sew the 3 rows together nesting the seams. Press seams towards the centre.



12. The block should measure 12 1/2". Leave block untrimmed.
